About this conference

There is a growing appreciation in Ireland of the difficulties of relying on congregate settings to support people to develop the lives of their choosing. A recent action research project was commissioned by Pobal to evaluate the capacity of services to respond to the wishes of people who use them.

48 people were selected nationally from the Brothers of Charity Services to take part in this project because they wanted to change their living conditions. This sample represented a diverse range of intellectual disabilities, accommodation types and varying supports needs.

Some were able to achieve significant progress towards living more socially inclusive lives; others were not. The research evaluates

- the effectiveness of Person Centred Planning
- what enables people to live more socially inclusive lives and develop self determination?
- the challenges (personal, staff, family and organisational) to changing services
- what model of accommodation effects social inclusion and lessons what have we learned?
- what services must do to become more person centred

A conference will convene on May 27 – 28 2010 to consider the findings of research. In a spirit of learning, the aim is to explore and discuss what is to be done to develop services to become more responsive to the wishes of those they purport to serve.
