





	<p>The Brothers of Charity Services aim to provide support for people to take part in all aspects of life, including education, training and employment.</p>
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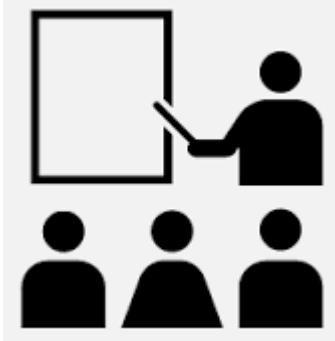
	<p>You will get support so that you can develop roles and use facilities in your community.</p>
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Guidelines

	<p>You will be supported to include training, education and employment in your Personal Plan and also the following if you choose.</p>
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To make your own choices and decisions, be independent and support to be healthy.



Accessing education, vocational training and work.



To be involved in your local community and to have a social role in it.



To work on your skills and help you take part in activities that you have an interest in.



To be involved in making policies.



The Personal Plan should be reviewed on an annual basis or more often if required



You will be supported to get training or a job in your community unless you do not want this.



If needed a risk assessment will be done to make sure that you are in control over your life and that you are an equal citizen.



You will be supported to practice skills that you have learnt in real life in your community.



You will be supported and encouraged to attend education, training and employment, if this is your wish.



You will be helped by staff to develop links and connect with family, friends and people close to you.



If you decide not to continue with your education, training or your job, the Service will help you look at other options and support your decision.
